Notes

Elliott ENLOW

Beers states that Elliott was a small boy when he came with his parents to Washington Co. Bell states that Elliott, third son of Abraham, was a ranger on the frontier about 1782 [from Pennsylvania, USA Archives]. He is listed in the 1800 Taxables list as a farmer. In 1801, Elliott was appointed supervisor for "Findley" Township, and reappointed in 1803. Beers states that he was a farmer his entire life, and a active Democrat. After his brother Luke's death, preaching services of the Methodist Episcopal Church were held at his house. Eventually a church was built, which became Stony Point Church, the deed given in 1863 by John Enlow, son of Elliott. He is listed as a Civil War veteran buried in the Claysville Cemetery. He is also listed in the KEYHOLE, Jan 1986 as buried in the Stony Point Methodist Church Cemetery. Not sure which is right. (NEW INFO: Picture of headstone on <findagrave.com> shows he is in Stony Point Cemetery 16Aug2008). His will is available in Washington Co, Pennsylvania, USA, Vol 6, p. 605, probated 1848.

Stony Point Methodist Episcopal, near the center of the township (E. Finley), was organized about 1826. The first meetings were held at the house of Luke Enlow and afterwards at the home of Elliott Enlow. The first church was built in 1830, and when the second edifice was erected it was from the lumber in the first building. Seven out of the sixteen persons who were the first members were of the Enlow Family and for this reason this is sometimes called Enlow Church. In the burial ground connected with this church is a handsome monument to the memory of George Sprowls, of Company K, 140th Pennsylvania, USA Volunteers, who died in Andersonville Prison, aged twenty-seven years. Jess M. sprowls, of the same company, was killed at Gettysburg, July 2, 1863.

Mary married John PATTERSON, son of Robert PATTERSON and Mary Ann VAN SCYOC, in 1805-1806 in Washington County, Pennsylvania. (John PATTERSON was born on August 5, 1782 in Huntington Township, York County, Pennsylvania, died on August 5, 1861 in Washington, Washington County, Pennsylvania and was buried in Stoney Point Methodist Cemetery, East Finley Township, Washington County, Pennsylvania.)

John ENLOW

John Enlow was born in 1802, in East Finley Township, Washington county, and received his education in the home school. He was married to Nancy, daughter of Robert Woods, one of the oldest pioneers of the Township, and the young people immediately settled on the home farm in East Finley Township, which became their permanent abiding place. They had one son, who died when ten years of age. After the death of his first wife John Enlow married Jemima Post, and to this union were born seven children: Sarah, wife of Rev. J. W. Hill; Martha, wife of John Hopkins; Mary, wife of Amos Sprowls; Nancy, wife of S. E. Martin; John M.; Gideon and Eleanor, both of whom died before reaching maturity. Mr. Enlow was a prominent member of the M. E. Church which was founded by his father. In political views he was a Democrat. He died September 16, 1876, and was followed to the grave by his wife in May, 1880.

Gideon ENLOW**AN ENLOW UPDATE**

In the October 1983 issue of KEYHOLE, we published a five-page article written by Dr. Raymond M. Bell. Our member in Nova Scotia, James St.Clair #1274, has sent us supplementary information which he also sent to Dr. Bell. With the permission of all correspondents involved, we offer these facts gleaned from our letters. (Keyhole) "On page 183, Gideon Enlow, the son of Elliott and Martha Atkinson Enlow is listed as having married ___ PRATT 1st and 2nd ___ SARGENT."

"The gravestones in the St.Clair Cemetery and in the Mt. Lebanon Cemetery in Clark County, Indiana, USA, both near Henryville and on the same road/ may help to clarify:

(From Mt. Lebanon Cemetery)

Gideon Enlow died 22 April 1858 aged 49 yrs 7 mos 22 ds

Rachel, wife of Gideon Enlow died 2 Feb. 1851 aged 30yrs 5 mos and 12 ds

(From St.Clair Cemetery)

Jemima, wife of J. Largent, b. 9 Mar. 1828 d. 15 Jan. 1901

John Largent b. 15 Sept. 1805 d. 8 Sept. 1878

Jemima was the daughter of Jesse and Margaret (Mitchell) St. Clair, all born Washington County, Pennsylvania, USA. and all died near Henryville, Clark County, Indiana, USA."

Thus Gideon Enlow was first married to Rachell Pratt of Washington County, Pennsylvania, USA., and after her death to Jemima St. Clair who was 24 years his junior -- and his first cousin once removed as her grandmother was Jemima Enlow St. Clair. Jemima 2nd married John Largent who was also originally from Western Pennsylvania, USA., and more than 20 years her senior. There were children from both of Gideon's marriages and at least one child from the marriage of Jemima and Largent. Jemima and Gideon married very soon after Rachel's death in 1851 because their first child was born in 1853."

James St.Clair says that his father well remembered Jemima St.Clair Enlow Largent. "She smoked a clay pipe and spoke of her journey down the Ohio River on a flatboat."

The date on the tombstone for Gideon Enlow is at variance with the date given in the material gathered from Tom Enlow which was quoted in the KEYHOLE by Dr. Bell.

Further, it may be useful to add here that there is a second grave marker for Rachel Pratt Enlow in the St.Clair Cemetery. It would appear that she was buried at St.Clair and that a second stone was erected on the Mt. Lebanon lot after Gideon was buried there.
