AN ENLOW UPDATE

In the October 1983 issue of KEYHOLE, we published a five-page article written by Dr. Raymond M. Bell. Our member in Nova Scotia, James St.Clair #1274, has sent us supplementary information which he also sent to Dr. Bell. With the permission of all correspondents involved, we offer these facts gleaned from our letters. (Keyhole) "On page 183, Gideon Enlow, the son of Elliott and Martha Atkinson Enlow is listed as having married PRATT lst and 2nd SARGENT."

"The gravestones in the St.Clair Cemetery and in the Mt. Lebanon Cemetery in Clark County, Indiana, USA, both near Henryville and on the same road/ may help to clarify:

(From Mt. Lebanon Cemetery)

Gideon Enlow died 22 April 1858 aged 49 yrs 7 mos 22 ds Rachel, wife of Gideon Enlow died 2 Feb. 1851 aged 30yrs 5 mos and 12 ds

(From St.Clair Cemetery)

Jemima, wife of J. Largent, b. 9 Mar. 1828 d. 15 Jan. 1901 John Largent b. 15 Sept. 1805 d. 8 Sept. 1878 Jemima was the daughter of Jesse and Margaret (Mitchell) St. Clair, all born Washington County, Pennsylvania, USA. and all died near Henryville, Clark County, Indiana, USA."

Thus Gideon Enlow was first married to Rachell Pratt of Washington County, Pennsylvania, USA., and after her death to Jemima St. Clair who was 24 years his junior -- and his first cousin once removed as her grandmother was Jemima Enlow St. Clair. Jemima 2nd married John Largent who was also originally from Western Pennsylvania, USA., and more than 20 years her senior. There were children from both of Gideon's marriages and at least one child from the marriage of Jemima and Largent. Jemima and Gideon married very soon after Rachel's death in 1851 because their first child was born in 1853."

James St.Clair says that his father well remembered Jemima St.Clair Enlow Largent. "She smoked a clay pipe and spoke of her journey down the Ohio River on a flatboat."

The date on the tombstone for Gideon Enlow is at variance with the date given in the material gathered from Tom Enlow which was quoted in the KEYHOLE by Dr. Bell.

Further, it may be useful to add here that there is a second grave marker for Rachel Pratt Enlow in the St.Clair Cemetery. It would appear that she was buried at St.Clair and that a second stone was erected on the Mt. Lebanon lot after Gideon was buried there.

Elliott W. ENLOW

Died at the home of his son, H. E. Enlow at 3:30 am of pneumonia Nov. 18, 1919 in Crafton, Pennsylvania, USA. He was the eldest of 5 brothers and 3 sisters. There is reference to a Mrs Nort Montgomery as being a daughter of Elliot and wife number 1. Benson, Charles, and Harry are the children of Elliot and his first wife. He married his second wife on Jan 5, 1893. There is also a daughter (Alice B. Mitchell) who was born Dec 2, 1861 mentioned. This girl was born in Marysville, Clark County, Indiana, USA and died Nov 1, 1862. She must have been a child from his first wife's previous marriage.

Joined as a Private in Company D of 77th Indiana, USA Volunteers August 7, 1862 to serve three years. He was discharged (Murfreesboro, Tennessee, USA) March 25th 1863 due to a disability. He was 25 years old 5 feet 10 inches tall, light complexion, blue eyes, light hair and occupation Farmer. (this is from discharge certificate)

He was a member of Patterson Jobes Post No. 555 Pennsylvania, USA

Elliott Enlow, Civil War veteran and former resident of Claysville, died at the home of his son, Edward Enlow, at Crafton, Pennsylvania, USA., Tuesday morning, Nov. 18, 1919, of pneumonia, after a brief illness, aged 84 years. The remains were brought to Claysville with the escort of the funeral party on Thursday, and service were held in the M.E. church, conducted by the pastor, Rev. J.W. Garland. The interment was in Claysville cemetery. Mr. Enlow was a native of Indiana, USA and in the Civil war served in Company D., Fourth Indiana, USA Cavalry. He was married twice. Of the first marriage three sons survive: Charles Enlow, in Texas; Edward Enlow, of Crafton, and B.C. Enlow, at Bellevernon. At Murdock, Ill, Jan. 5, 1893, he was united in marriage to Mrs. Ellen Enlow, nee Howell, whose deceased husband, also bore the same name as her second husband. He came to East Finley and located near, Stony Point 28 years ago. For a number of years, he resided on Petroleum avenue, where Mrs. Enlow died. He resided for some time at Donors, only recently going to Crafton. He was a member of Patterson Jones Post 555, G.A.R. He was a member of Stony Point M.E. church and later of Claysville, M.E. church. He leaves two brothers, Henry Enlow, in California, and J.I. Enlow, of Terra Haute, Ind.

1880 Pennsylvania, USA Census has his mother-in-law (Margaret Howell) living with them, her age was 94 in 1880. Also two other people (Alexander Redmond (age 25) and Elizabeth Russel (age 15) were living with them at the time of the census.

Regimental History Forty-ninth Infantry INDIANA (3-YEARS)

Forty-ninth Infantry. Cols., John W. Ray, James Keigwin;

Lieut.Cols., Joseph H. Thornton, Arthur J. Hawhe, Tames Leeper, James A. Gardner; Majs., Joseph H. Thornton, Arthur J. Hawhe, James Leeper, John R. Hamacher.

This regiment was organized at Jeffersonville and was mustered in Nov. 21, 1861. It left the state Dec. 11 for Bardstown, Ky., and left there Jan. 12, 1862, for Cumberland Ford, where it remained until June, suffering greatly at the latter place from disease.

It was in skirmishes at Big Tree Gap and Cumberland Gap in March; accompanied Gen. Morgan's forces to Cumberland Gap in June, and occupied the place on the 18th, the enemy retiring the same day. It remained there until September, when it joined in the retreat to the Ohio river, reaching Greenupsburg, Ky., early in October.

It proceeded to Coal Mouth, W. Va., and in November was ordered to Memphis joining Sherman's army on the expedition to Vicksburg. It was in the battle at Chickasaw Bluffs, losing 56 in killed and wounded, and was in the expedition against Arkansas Post.

Notes (con't)

It assisted in digging a canal across Young's point, and then moved for the rear of Vicksburg, participating in the battles of Port Gibson, Champion's Hill and Black River bridge. It was then engaged in the siege of Vicksburg until its fall, including the assault of May 22.

It took part in the seven days' siege of Jackson in July, and was ordered to New Orleans in August being assigned to the Department of the Gulf. It moved to Berwick's Bay, took part in the Teche expedition, going as far as Opelousas, and on its return to New Orleans was ordered to Texas, reaching Matagorda Peninsula, Dec. 14.

It moved to Indianola, where on Feb. 3, 1864 171 reenlisted. It embarked at Matagorda Island April 19, for Alexandria, La., where it reinforced Banks' army and was in continuous skirmishes until May 13, when the army retreated to the Mississippi.

It returned to New Orleans, was furloughed home in July, was ordered to Lexington, Ky., at the expiration of its furlough, and remained there until Sept. 7. It then proceeded to Louisville, where it was mustered out Sept. 13, 1865, having marched 8,000 miles during its service.

Its original strength was 974; gain by recruits, 294; reenlistments, 177; total, 1,445. Loss by death, 238, desertion, 94; unaccounted for, 42.
