The second annual Jeannerett reunion was held at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Julian Vincent, Wayne Township, on July 4 (1939). Fifty persons attended and enjoyed a basket picnic at noon. In the evening the group went to Vincent's hall at Cochranon where others joined them in a square dance. The day was Mrs. Vincent's birthday and she was remembered with a gift from the group.

1. □Newspaperarticle, Meadville Tribune, on card file in Meadville Historical Society□Private Vincent with the 9th A.A.F, a veteran of 17 months overseas service with the 9th Air Force in Europe. Private Vincent received his discharge from service Monday at Indiantown Gap July 22, 1945.

2. □Letterfrom Jim & Ruby Vincent dated November 28, 2003.□

James Vincent was a Corporal, drafted March 2, 1943, where he served in England and France. He was about to be sent to Germany when the war ended.

He was in the Army 9th Air Force served with the 647th Bomber Squadron 410 Bomb Group. He was a refueler for A20 and B26 aircraft. He was involved with the D Day (June 6, 1944) invasion while in England. He was discharged October 8, 1945.

Jim and Ruby were married Feb 6, 1954 at Marienville, Pennsylvania, USA at the Presbyterian Church. They lived in Springboro, Pennsylvania, USA and Jim had an auto repair garage there with his cousin Buss Mailliard. Ruby continued to work as a nurse at the hospital in Meadville till they wanted to change her shift to a split shift.

3. "Jim sent the following information to George Russell Enlow in 2006,"

James H. Vincent (Drafted)

DATE OF ENTRY: March 2, 1943 at Erie, Pennsylvania

TRAINING: Boat training at Biloxi, Mississippi. Had Special Vehicle Operator training.

UNIT: 647 Bomb Squad 410 Bomb Group, 9th Air Force.

DUTIES: My job was driving gas trucks and fueling the planes. In wintertime we had to dilute the oil so we could start the planes in the morning to run long enough to burn gas back out of the oil, so that they would be ready for the pilots to start.

DATE OF DEPARTURE: March 23, 1944 (1 year 2 months 14 days training). Left by convoy boat Saturnia,

it was the largest Hospital ship after arriving in EUROPE. It was formerly an Italian luxury liner.

FOREIGN SERVICE: 1 year, 4 months, 23 days. Landed in Glasgow Scotland by boat, April 3, 1944. From there we went to England. After D-Day we went to France staying near Paris. The group flew A20 and A-26 in G.O. 33, 40 WD 45 air offensive around the clock during the Normandy invasion. Was in Europe, Normandy, Northern France, Rhineland, Ardennes, and central Europe.

MEDALS: Good Conduct, European, Africa, Middle Eastern Service with Six Bronze Stars.

CLASSIFICATION: Corporal

Left France to return to the United States by boat on July 31, 1945. Arrived in USA on August 13, 1945. Went by train to Washington, D.C. Stopped because of celebration of Japan surrendering. They put guards around the train so we couldn't get off the train. When things settled down, we continued on our way to Separation Center at Indian Town Gap Military Reserve, Pennsylvania. There I was put on a 30 day leave, then went back to Indian Town Gap and was discharged on October 8, 1945, after the Chaplain found my papers in the dead file. I had enough points to be discharged.

4. Newspaper clipping from 1941: James Vincent of R.D. 6 Cochran was reported to have recovered from burns on one arm said to have been suffered at the Meadville bakery. His sister, Shirley, who fell in the barn at her parents' home and sustained a broken arm, is recuperating satisfactorily. (Clipping is in Scrapbook in Leonard Enlows' possession)
